

Unit: Daily Life

Lesson 4.1: At the Movies (There's nothing like the silver screen to bring an era to life!)

<u>Aim</u>: To learn about daily life, politics, slavery, the draft, and the war in New York during the Civil War era.

Objective: Students view clips from either Ric Burns's *The Center of the World: New York* (1820-1865) (PBS) or Martin Scorcese's *The Gangs of New York* (Miramax, 2002)* to learn about life during the Civil War era.

*Note: While this hit movie will give students a vivid picture of old New York and its inhabitants, there are many explicit and inappropriate (violent and sexual) scenes, so it cannot be viewed in its entirety.

Materials:

- 1. VCR
- 2. One or both or the above-mentioned videos

Procedure:

- 1. Teacher previews one or both of the above films.
- 2. Choose clips to share with class highlighting various aspects of daily life.
- 3. Prepare comprehension and discussion questions in advance.
- 4. Pause video every few minutes for a question/answer period to facilitate active listening.
- 5. Students can write responses to the films, sharing their observations and reactions or comparing these images with the New York they know.
